Since taking office in March, I have already been involved in two wonderful community events. The first was the launch of the Croke Park Community Mosaic created by the local children of St. Columba's School in the North Strand. More recently, I had the pleasure of welcoming over one hundred local residents to the stadium for the Croke Park Community Fund Reception. It was inspiring to meet local residents from Summerhill, Ballybough, Clonliffe, Iona, Fairview, Dorset Street, East Wall and the North Strand who make such an important contribution to the local community around Croke Park through their voluntary work.

I have been elected as President of the GAA at an important time as we work to build a new long-term accord with the local community around Croke Park. I would like to acknowledge the support of the Lord Mayor of Dublin, Christy Burke and Minister Paschal Donohoe TD who offered their assistance last September to begin this process. We are actively engaging in all community meetings, and with Noeline Blackwell, Director General of the Free Legal Advice Centres, who is the independent chairperson for this process.

As we are now on the verge of a busy Summer schedule of concerts and match days, I would like to thank you for your continued support and cooperation during event days. I also look forward to working with the Croke Park team and the local community on issues of concern to all of us during my tenure as Uachtarán Chumann Lúthchleas Gael.

CROKE PARK COMMUNITY FUND

Croke Park has an annual fund of €100,000 which is used to support community projects in the immediate area around the stadium. The fund has now allocated over €600,000 to local community groups since 2009.

The remaining closing dates for funding applications in 2015 are:

- 8 July 2015
- 16 September 2015
- 11 November 2015

In March, local pupils from St. Columba's National School, North Strand unveiled a special mosaic in Croke Park which is entitled "Conas a fuair Cú Chulainn a ainm" (How Cú Chulainn got his name). The mosaic was created by the pupils of St. Columba's National School with support from the Croke Park Community Fund. The mosaic is hanging in the inner Cusack Stand concourse and will be viewed by many thousands of visitors making their way into the stadium each year.

GARDA CORDON

The garda cordon will be in place earlier on concert days to enhance parking control and local resident access. Local resident parking passes for households within the garda cordon are available from the Garda Station on Fitzgibbon Street: telephone 01 666 8400.

CROKE PARK COMMUNITY TEAM

Croke Park's Community Officer and Community Team will be on duty on Saturday, June 20th to assist local residents on any stadium related matter and can be contacted directly by using the stadium's community freephone number or email address.

LOCAL RESIDENTS REQUIRING SPECIAL ASSISTANCE

CONCERT CLEAN UP

Additional community litter teams will be active during the concert & will work to remove concert litter from gardens within the garda cordon.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT/PARKING PLANS

A full public transport & car parking information campaign targeting concert patrons is currently ongoing. Special car parking offers from car parks nearest the stadium are available to concert patrons and additional Dublin Bus, LUAS, Irish Rail & Bus Eireann public transport initiatives to and from concerts have been organised. Gardaí & Dublin Street Park Services will be enforcing parking legislation throughout the community area and there will be specific coach & bus parking areas on the Alfie Byrne Road in operation.

PRE-CONCERT WORKS

Pre-concert works commence Wednesday, June 10th 2015. Works are scheduled between 8am – 8pm* daily from June 10th – June 14th and between 8am – 10pm* daily from June 15th – June 19th.

POST-CONCERT WORKS

Post-concert works commence on Sunday, June 21st with the site to be clear on Friday, June 26th 2015. Works are scheduled between 8am – 10pm* daily.

*Concert works timings will be agreed by Dublin City Council

SOUND CHECKS & MONITORING

The rehearsals and sound checks for the concert will be carried out in the early evening of Friday, June 19th and will cease at 8pm. An independent sound monitoring team will be appointed and an environment noise assessment will be conducted for the concert.

OVERNIGHT QUEUING/CAMPING

Overnight queuing or camping will not be tolerated.

USE OF GARDA HELICOPTER

The Garda Helicopter will be used on the evening of Saturday, June 20th. It will only be used as required by the gardaí and with minimum time spent in operation.
