



Visual Guide



The entrance of the Museum is on the Cusack side of the Stadium.

I can go in a straight line from the car park to the Museum.



The wheelchair access is just to the right. Once down the ramp, I can press the button to open the doors automatically



Once inside, the Museum Help Desk will be at my left.

I can go up to a staff member and ask when and where my tour will start.

Staff members will be wearing this uniform or a lanyard



I will then wait for my tour to start in the Yellow Area. I can sit on the benches or go to the toilet, right next to them.



If I have big bags or want to leave my belongings before going on the tour, I can use one of the free lockers available.



The Blackthorne Cafe is next to the lockers. They serve hot food and drinks.

I can call the Museum ahead of time and ask for the Menu!

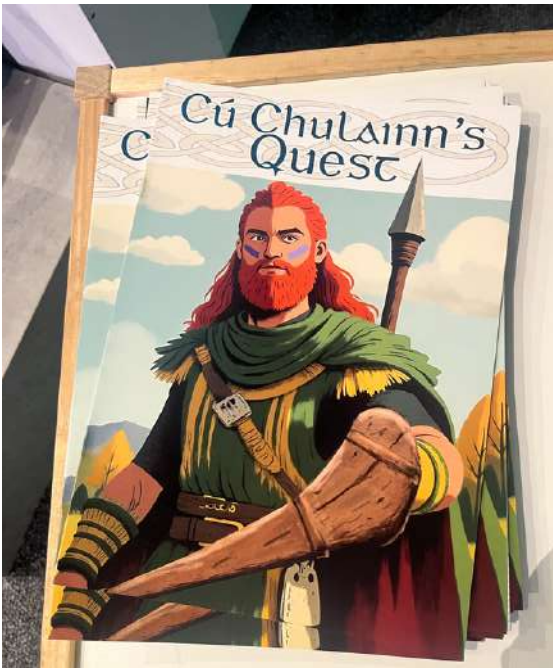


I can also visit the GAA Museum Gift Shop, just before the waiting area, to the right of the Help Desk.

There is a space there to watch a video, the sound might surprise me!

The exhibition starts on the right. It includes the founding of the association.



A little further, I will find a second video space.

This one is about Bloody Sunday and might contain emotional topics



I will also find other exhibitions. One of them is the Museum's temporary exhibit space.

The other is the GAA Hall of Fame



The Museum's trophy cabinet is at the back.

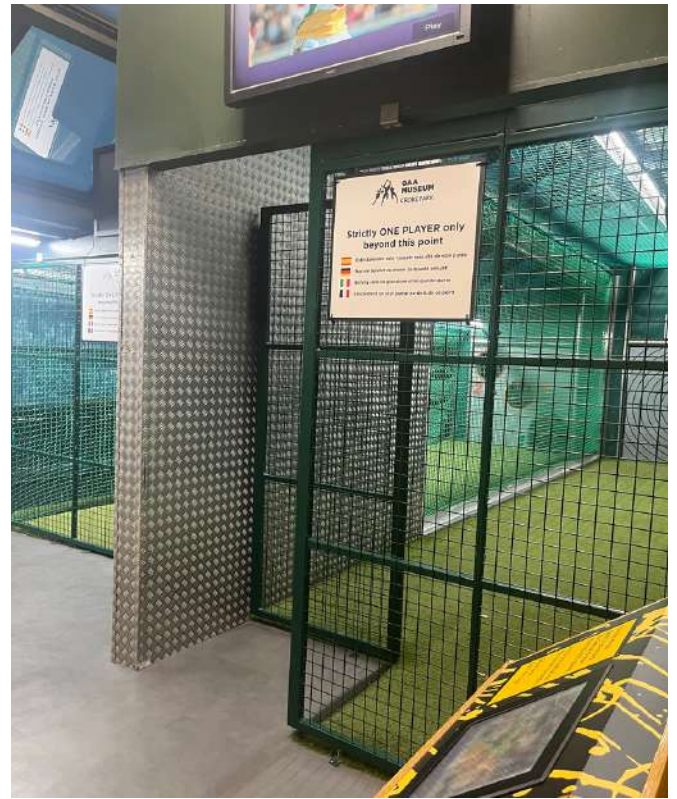
I can climb the stairs next to it to access the rest of the Museum

I can ring the bell when I want to come back down

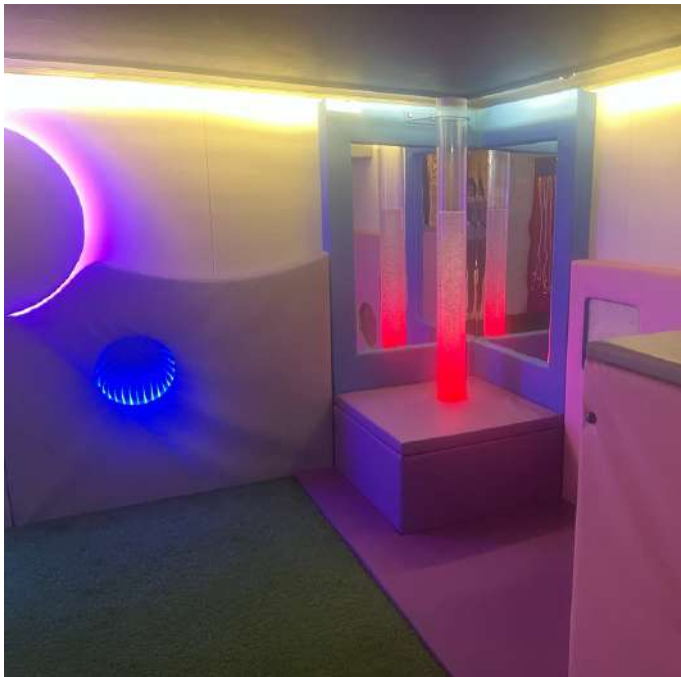


The exhibition continues on the first floor with LGFA and Camogie sections as well as others!
